14 And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

15 John bare witness of him, and cried, saying, This was he of whom I spake, He that cometh after me is preferred before me: for he was before me.

16 And of his fulness have all we received, and grace for grace.

17 For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.

18 No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.

19 And this is the record of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, Who art thou?

20 And he confessed, and denied not; but confessed, I am not the Christ.

21 And they asked him, What then? Art thou Elias? And he saith, I am not. Art thou that prophet? And he answered, No.

22 Then said they unto him, Who art thou? that we may give an answer to them that sent us. What sayest thou of thyself?

23 He said, I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness,

25 And they asked him, and said unto him, Why baptizest thou then, if thou be not that Christ, nor Elias, neither that prophet?

26 John answered them, saying, I baptize with water: but there standeth one among you, whom ye know not;

27 He it is, who cometh after me is preferred before me, whose shoe's latchet I am not worthy to unloose.

28 These things were done in Bethabara beyond Jordan, where John was baptizing.

29 The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.

30 This is he of whom I said, After me cometh a man which is preferred before me: for he was before me.

31 And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing with water.

32 And John bare record, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon him.

33 And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost.

34 And I saw, and bare record that this is the Son of God.

35 Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples;

36 And looking upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God!

37 And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.

38 Then Jesus turned, and saw them following, and saith unto them, ^aWhat seek ye? They said unto him, ^cRabbi, (which is to say, being interpreted, Master,) where ^ddwell-est thou?

39 He saith unto them, Come and see. They came and saw where he dwelt, and abode with him that day: for it was ^eabout the tenth hour.

40 ^fOne of the two which heard John *speak*, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.

41 He first findeth ^ghis own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the ^hMessias, which is, being interpreted, ⁱthe Christ.

42 And he brought him to Jesus. And when Jesus ^jbeheld him, he said, Thou art ^kSimon the son of Jona: thou shalt be called ^lCephas, which is by interpretation, ^mA stone.

43 ⁿThe day following Jesus would ^ogo forth into Galilee, and findeth Philip, and saith unto him, Follow me.

44 Now ^pPhilip was of ^qBethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter.

45 Philip findeth ^rNathanael, and saith unto him, We have found him, of whom ^sMoses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus ^tof Nazareth, ^uthe son of Joseph.

46 And Nathanael said unto him, ^vCan there any good thing come out of Nazareth? Philip saith unto him, Come and see.

47 Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and saith of him, Behold an ^wIsraelite indeed, ^xin whom is no guile!

48 Nathanael saith unto him, ^yWhence knowest thou me? Jesus answered and said unto him, Before that Philip called thee, when thou wast under the fig tree, I saw thee.

49 Nathanael answered and

saith unto him, ^aRabbi, thou art ^bthe Son of God; thou art ^cthe King of Israel.

50 Jesus answered and said unto him, Because I said unto thee, I saw thee under the fig tree, ^dbelievest thou? thou shalt see greater things than these.

51 And he saith unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto you, ^eHereafter ye shall see ^fheaven open, and ^gthe angels of God ascending and descending upon ^hthe Son of man.

CHAPTER 2.

10 And saith unto him, Every man at the beginning doth set forth good wine; and when men have well drunk, then that which is worse: but thou hast kept the good wine until now.

11 This beginning of miracles did Jesus in Cana of Galilee, and manifested forth his glory; and his disciples believed on him.

12 ¶ After this he went down to Capernaum, he, and his mother, and his brethren, and his disciples: and they continued there not many days.

13 ¶ And the Jews' passover was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem,

14 And found in the temple those that sold oxen and sheep and doves, and the changers of money sitting:

15 And when he had made a scourge of small cords, he drove them all out of the temple, and the sheep, and the oxen; and poured out the changers' money, and overthrew the tables;

9 Nicodemus answered and said unto him, How can these things be?

10 Jesus answered and said unto him, Art thou a master of Israel, and knowest not these things?

11 Verily, verily, I say unto thee, We speak that we do know, and testify that we have seen; and ye receive not our witness.

12 If I have told you earthly things, and ye believe not, how shall ye believe, if I tell you of heavenly things?

13 And no man hath ascended up to heaven, but he that came down from heaven, even the Son of man which is in heaven.

14 ¶ And as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, even so must the Son of man be lifted up: Amongst People

15 That whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have eternal life.

16 ¶ For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

17 For God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved.

18 ¶ He that believeth on him is not condemned: but he that believeth not is condemned already, because he hath not believed in the name of the only begotten Son of God.

19 And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil.

20 For every one that doeth evil hateth the light, neither

cometh to the light, lest his deeds should be reproved.

21 But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God.

22 ¶ After these things came Jesus and his disciples into the land of Judæa; and there he tarried with them, and baptized.

23 ¶ And John also was baptizing in Ænon near to Salim, because there was much water there: and they came, and were baptized.

24 For John was not yet cast into prison.

25 ¶ Then there arose a question between some of John's disciples and the Jews about purifying.

26 And they came unto John, and said unto him, Rabbi, he that was with thee beyond Jordan, to whom thou barest witness, behold, the same baptizeth, and all men come to him.

27 John answered and said, A man can receive nothing, except it be given him from heaven.

28 Ye yourselves bear me witness, that I said, I am not the Christ, but that I am sent before him.

29 He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled.

30 He must increase, but I must decrease.

31 ¶ He that cometh from above is above all: he that is of the earth is earthly, and speaketh of the earth: he that cometh from heaven is above all.

32 And what he hath seen and heard, that he testifieth; and no man receiveth his testimony.

36 ^g He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him.

CHAPTER 4.

¹ Christ talketh with a woman of Samaria. ³⁷ His zeal for God's glory. ³⁸ Many Samaritans believe. ⁴³ He departeth into Galilee, and healeth the ruler's son.

WHEN therefore the Lord knew how the Pharisees had heard that Jesus made and ^b baptized more disciples than John,

³ He left ^o Judæa, and departed ^p again into Galilee.

⁴ And he ^q must needs go through ^r Samaria.

⁵ Then cometh he to a city of Samaria, which is called ^s Sychar, near to the parcel of ground ^t that Jacob gave to his son Joseph.

⁶ Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied ^u with his journey, sat ^v thus on the well: and it was about ^w the sixth hour.

⁷ There cometh a woman of Samaria to draw water: Jesus saith unto her, Give me to drink.

⁸ (For his disciples were gone away unto ^x the city to buy meat.)

⁹ Then saith the woman of Samaria unto him, How is it that thou, being a Jew, askest drink of me, which am a woman of Samaria? for ^y the Jews have no dealings with the Samaritans.

¹¹ The woman saith unto him, Sir, thou hast nothing to draw with, and the well is deep: from whence then hast thou that living water?

¹² Art thou greater than our father Jacob, which gave us the well, and drank thereof himself, and his children, and his cattle?

¹³ Jesus answered and said unto her, Whosoever drinketh of this water shall thirst again:

¹⁴ But ⁱ whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall be in him a well of water springing up into ^j everlasting life.

¹⁵ The woman saith unto him, Sir, give me this water, that I thirst not, neither come hither to draw.

¹⁶ Jesus saith unto her, Go, ^k call thy husband, and come hither.

¹⁷ The woman answered and said, I have no husband. Jesus said unto her, Thou hast well said, I have no husband:

¹⁸ For thou hast had five husbands; and he whom thou now hast is not thy husband: in that saidst thou truly.

¹⁹ The woman saith unto him, Sir, I perceive that thou art ^l a prophet.

²⁰ Our fathers worshipped in ^m this mountain; and ye say, that in ⁿ Jerusalem is the place where men ought to worship.

²¹ Jesus saith unto her, Woman, believe me, ^o the hour cometh, ^p when ye shall neither in this mountain, nor yet at Jerusalem, worship ^q the Father.

²² Ye worship ^r ye know not what: we know what we worship: ^s for salvation is of the Jews.

²³ But ^t the hour cometh, and

If the first means he can loose it the rest of the means he can receive it.

now is, when the true worshippers shall worship the Father in ^b spirit and in ^c truth: for the Father ^e seeketh such to worship him.

24 ^f God is a Spirit: and they that worship him must worship him in ^b spirit and in ^c truth.

25 The woman saith unto him, I know that ^g Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, ^h he will ^m tell us all things.

26 Jesus saith unto her, ⁿ I that speak unto thee am he.

27 ¶ And upon this came his disciples, and marvelled that he talked with the woman: yet no man said, What seekest thou? or, Why talkest thou with her?

28 The woman then left her waterpot, and went her way into the city, and saith to the men,

29 Come, see a man, ^o which told me all things that ever I did: ^p is not this the Christ?

30 Then they went out of the city, and came unto him.

31 ¶ In the mean while his disciples prayed him, saying, ^q Master, ^v eat.

32 But he said unto them, I have meat to eat that ye know not of.

33 Therefore said the disciples one to another, ^r Hath any man brought him ought to eat?

34 Jesus saith unto them, ^d My meat is ^o to do the will of him that sent me, and ^h to finish his work.

35 Say not ye, There are yet four months, and then cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, ^l Lift up your eyes, and look on ^m the fields; ⁿ for they are white already to harvest.

36 And he that reapeth receiveth ^p wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both ^o he that soweth and ^h he that reapeth may rejoice together.

37 And herein is that saying

true, ^a One soweth, and another reapeth.

38 I sent you to reap ^d that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ^o ye are entered into their labours.

39 ¶ And many of the Samaritans of ^h that city believed on him for the saying of ^h the woman, which testified, ^h He told me all that ever I did.

40 So when the Samaritans were come unto him, they besought him that he would ^o tarry with them: and he ^o abode there two days.

41 And many more believed because of his own word;

42 And said unto the woman, Now we believe, not because of thy saying: for we have heard him ourselves, and know that this is indeed the Christ, ^p the Saviour of the world.

43 ¶ Now after ^o two days he departed thence, and ^o went into Galilee.

44 For Jesus himself testified, ⁿ that a prophet hath no honour in his own country.

45 Then when he was come into Galilee, the Galilæans ^r received him, ^a having seen, all the things that he did at Jerusalem at the feast: ^b for they also went unto the feast.

46 So Jesus came again into ^o Cana of Galilee, ^j where he made the water wine. And there was a certain ^o nobleman, whose son was sick at ⁱ Capernaum.

47 When he heard that Jesus was come ^h out of Judæa into Galilee, he went unto him, and besought him that he would ^o come down, and heal his son: for he was at the point of death.

48 Then said Jesus unto him, ^o Except ye see ^s signs and ^e wonders, ye will not believe.

49 The nobleman saith unto

him, Sir, ^a come down ^b ere my child die.

50 Jesus saith unto him, Go thy way; thy son liveth. And the man believed the word that Jesus had spoken unto him, and he went his way.

51 And as he was now ^a going down, his servants met him, and told him, saying, Thy son liveth.

52 Then enquired he of them the hour when he began to amend. And they said unto him, Yesterday at ^d the seventh hour the fever left him.

53 So the father knew that it was at the same hour, in the which Jesus said unto him, Thy son liveth: and himself believed, and his whole house.

54 ^h This is again the second miracle that Jesus did, when he was come ⁱ out of Judæa into Galilee.

CHAPTER 5.

^x Jesus on the sabbath day cureth one diseased for eight and thirty years. ^{xo} The Jews therefore cavil. ^{xvii} He reproveth them, shewing by the testimony of his Father, ^{xx} of John, ^{xxv} of his works, ^{xxviii} and of the scriptures, who he is.

AFTER this there was ^k a feast of the Jews; and Jesus ⁱ went up to Jerusalem.

2 Now there is at Jerusalem by the sheep ^m market a pool, which is called ^o in the Hebrew tongue Bethesda, having five porches.

3 In these lay a great multitude of impotent folk, of blind, halt, ^p withered, waiting for the moving of the water.

4 For ^r an angel went down at a certain season into the pool, and troubled the water: who-soever then first after the troubling of the water stepped in was made whole of what-soever disease he had.

5 And a certain man was there, which had an infirmity thirty and eight years.

6 When Jesus saw him lie, and knew that he had been

now a long time in that case, he saith unto him, Wilt thou be made whole?

7 The impotent man answered him, Sir, I have no man, when the water is troubled, to put me into the pool: but while I am coming, another steppeth down before me.

8 Jesus saith unto him, ^c Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.

9 And immediately the man was made whole, and took up his bed, and walked: and on the same day ^e was the sabbath.

10 ¶ The Jews therefore said unto him that was cured, It is the sabbath day: ^o it is not lawful for thee to carry thy bed.

11 He answered them, He that made me whole, the same said unto me, Take up thy bed, and walk.

12 Then asked they him, What man is that which said unto thee, Take up thy bed, and walk?

13 And he that was healed wist not who it was: for Jesus had conveyed himself away, ^a a multitude being in that place.

14 Afterward Jesus findeth him in the temple, and said unto him, Behold, thou art made whole: ^m sin no more, ⁿ lest a worse thing come unto thee.

15 The man departed, and told the Jews that it was Jesus, which had made him whole.

16 And therefore did the Jews persecute Jesus, and sought to slay him, because ^r he had done these things on the sabbath day.

17 ¶ But Jesus ^s answered them, My Father ^t worketh hitherto, ^u and I work.

18 Therefore the Jews ^v sought the more to kill him, because he not only had broken the sabbath, but ^w said also that God was ^x his Father, ^y making himself equal with God.

19 Then answered Jesus and said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, The Son can do

He answereth for himself, St. JOHN 5. and reproveth the Jews.

nothing ^a of himself, but what he seeth the Father do: for what things soever he doeth, these also doeth the Son likewise.

20 For ^d the Father loveth the Son, and sheweth him all things that himself doeth: and ^f he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel.

21 For as the Father raiseth up the dead, and ^g quickeneth them; even so the Son quickeneth whom he will.

22 For the Father judgeth no man, but ^h hath committed all ^h judgment unto the Son:

23 That all men should honour the Son, even as they ⁱ honour the Father. ^h He that honoureth not the Son honoureth not the Father which hath sent him.

24 Verily, verily, I say unto you, ^h He that heareth my word, and believeth on him that sent me, hath everlasting life, and shall not come into condemnation; but ⁱ is passed from death unto life.

25 Verily, verily, I say unto you, ^h The hour is coming, and now is, when ^h the dead shall hear ^h the voice of the Son of God: and they that hear shall live.

26 For as the Father hath life in himself; ^h so hath he given to the Son to have life in himself;

27 And ^h hath given him ^h authority to execute ^h judgment also, ^h because he is the Son of man.

28 ^h Marvel not at this: for the hour is coming, in the which all that are in the graves shall hear ^h his voice,

29 ^h And shall come forth; ^h they that have ^h done good, unto the resurrection of life; and they that have ^h done evil, unto the resurrection of damnation.

30 ^h I can of mine own self do nothing: as I hear, I judge: and my judgment is just; because ^h I seek not mine own

31 ^c If I bear witness of myself, my witness is not true.

32 ^d There is ^e another that beareth witness of me; and I know that the witness which he witnesseth of me is true.

33 ^e Ye sent unto John, and ^f he bare witness unto the truth.

34 But I receive not testimony from man: but these things I say, that ye might be saved.

35 He was a burning and ^h a shining ^h light: and ye were willing ^h for a season to rejoice in his light.

36 ^h But I have ^h greater witness than ^h that of John: for ^h the works which ^h the Father hath given me to finish, the same works that I do, bear witness of me, that ^h the Father hath sent me.

37 And the Father himself, which hath sent me, ^h hath borne witness of me. Ye have neither heard his voice at any time, nor ^h seen his shape.

38 And ^h ye have not his word abiding in you: for whom he hath sent, him ye believe not.

39 ^h Search the scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life: and ^h they are they which testify of me.

40 And ^h ye will not come to me, that ye might have life.

41 I receive not ^h honour from men.

42 But ^h I know you, that ye have not ^h the love of God in you.

43 ^h I am come in my Father's name, and ye receive me not: if ^h another shall come in his own name, him ye will receive.

44 How can ye believe, which receive ^h honour one of another, and seek not ^h the honour that cometh from God ^h only?

45 Do not think ^h that I will accuse you to the Father: ^h there is one that accuseth you, even Moses, ^h in whom ye trust.

¹ Christ feedeth five thousand. ¹⁹ He walketh on the sea to his disciples: ³² declareth himself to be the bread of life to believers. ⁶⁶ Many disciples forsake him. ⁶⁸ Peter confesseth him. ⁷⁰ Judas is a devil.

A^FTER these things ^e Jesus went over ^f the sea of Galilee, which is ^g the sea of Tiberias.

² And a great multitude followed him, ^h because they saw his miracles which he did on them that were diseased.

³ And Jesus went up into ^m a mountain, and there he sat with ⁱ his disciples.

⁴ And ^o the passover, a feast of the Jews, was nigh.

⁵ ¶ When Jesus then ^r lifted up ^s his eyes, and saw a great company come unto him, he saith unto ^t Philip, Whence shall we buy bread, that these may eat?

⁶ And this he said ^u to prove him: for he himself knew what he would do.

⁷ ¶ Philip answered him, Two hundred pennyworth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may take a little.

⁸ One of his disciples, ^v Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, saith unto him,

⁹ There is a lad here, which hath five barley loaves, and two ^w small fishes: but what are they among so many?

¹⁰ And Jesus said, Make the men sit down. Now ^x there was much grass in the place. So ^y the men sat down, in number about five thousand.

¹¹ And Jesus took the loaves; and when he had ^z given thanks, he distributed to the disciples, and the disciples to them that

were set down; and likewise of the fishes as much as they would.

¹² When they were filled, he said unto his disciples, Gather up the fragments that remain, that nothing be lost.

¹³ Therefore they gathered ^{aa} them together, and filled twelve ^{ab} baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves, which remained over and above unto them that had eaten.

¹⁴ Then those men, when they had seen the miracle that Jesus did, said, This is of a truth ^{ac} that prophet ^{ad} that should come into the world.

¹⁵ ¶ ^{ae} When Jesus therefore perceived that they would come and take him by force, to make him ^{af} a king, he departed again ^{ag} into a mountain himself alone.

¹⁶ And when even was ^{ah} now come, his disciples went down unto the sea,

¹⁷ And entered into ^{ai} a ship, and went over the sea toward ^{aj} Capernaum. And it was now dark, and Jesus was not come to them.

¹⁸ And the sea arose by reason of a great wind that blew.

¹⁹ So when they had rowed about ^{ak} five and twenty or thirty ^{al} furlongs, they see Jesus walking on the sea, and drawing nigh unto the ship: and they were afraid.

²⁰ But he saith unto them, It is I; be not afraid.

²¹ Then they willingly received him into the ship: and immediately ^{am} the ship was at the land whither they went.

²² ¶ The day following, when the people which stood ^{an} on the other side of the sea saw that there was none other ^{ao} boat there, save that one whereinto his disciples were entered, and that Jesus went not with his disciples into the boat, but that his disciples were gone away alone;

38 For ^mI came down from heaven, not to do ⁿmine own will, but the will of him that sent me.

39 And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of ^vall which he hath given me ^oI should lose nothing, but ^qshould raise it up again at the last day.

40 And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which ^sseeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day.

41 ^rThe Jews then murmured at him, because he said, ^tI am the bread which came down from heaven.

42 And they said, Is not this Jesus, ^bthe son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? how is it then that he saith, I came down from heaven?

43 Jesus therefore answered and said unto them, Murmur not among yourselves.

44 No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me ^rdraw him: and I will raise him up at the last day.

45 It is written ^vin the prophets, ^hAnd they shall be all taught of God. Every man therefore that hath heard, and ⁱhath learned of the Father, cometh unto me.

46 ⁱNot that any man hath seen the Father, ^msave he which is ⁿof God, he hath seen the Father.

47 Verily, verily, I say unto

you, ^aHe that believeth on me hath everlasting life.

48 ^dI am that bread of life.

49 Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead.

50 This is the bread ^vwhich cometh down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and ⁱnot die.

51 I am the living bread ⁱwhich came down from heaven: ^mif any man eat of this bread, he shall live for ever: and ^othe bread that I will give is my flesh, which ^pI will give for the life of the world.

52 The Jews therefore ^rstrove among themselves, saying, ⁱHow can this man give us ^{his}flesh to eat?

53 Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except ^zye eat the flesh of the Son of man, and ^zdrink his blood, ye have no life in you.

54 Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, ^bhath eternal life; and ^cI will raise him up at the last day.

55 For my flesh is meat indeed, and my blood is drink indeed.

56 He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, ^vdwelleth in me, and I in him.

57 As the living Father hath sent me, and ⁱI live by the Father: so he that eateth me, even he shall live by me.

58 This is ^kthat bread ⁱwhich came down from heaven: ^mnot as your fathers did eat manna, and are dead: he that eateth of this bread shall live for ever.

59 These things said he in the synagogue, as he taught in ^vCapernaum.

60 ^rMany therefore of his disciples, when they had heard ^{his}, said, This is an ⁱhard saying; ^zwho can hear it?

61 When Jesus ^vknew in himself that his disciples murmured at it, he said unto them, Doth this offend you?

69 ^vAnd we believe and are sure that thou art that Christ, ^dthe Son of ^ethe living God.

70 Jesus answered them, Have not ^fI chosen you twelve, and one of you is a devil?

71 He spake of Judas Iscariot ^hthe son of Simon: for he it was that should betray him, being one of ^uthe twelve.

CHAPTER 7.

ⁱ Jesus reproveth the boldness of his kinsmen: ¹⁰ goeth secretly to the feast: ¹⁴ teacheth in the temple. ⁴⁰ Divers opinions of Christ. ⁴⁵ The Pharisees are angry that their officers took him not.

AFTER these things Jesus ^wwalked in Galilee: for ⁿhe would not walk in Jewry, ^obecause ^pthe Jews sought to kill him.

2 Now the Jews' ^rfeast of tabernacles was at hand.

3 ^uHis brethren therefore said unto him, Depart hence, and go into Judæa, that ^zthy disciples also may see the works that thou doest.

4 For there is no man that

doeth any thing in secret, and he himself seeketh to be known openly. If thou do these things, shew thyself to the world.

5 For neither did his brethren believe in him.

6 Then Jesus said unto them, My time is not yet come: but your time is always ready.

7 The world cannot hate you; but me it hateth, because I testify of it, that the works thereof are evil.

8 Go ye up unto this feast: I go not up yet unto this feast; for my time is not yet full come.

9 When he had said these words unto them, he abode still in Galilee.

10 ¶ But when his brethren were gone up, then went he also up unto the feast, not openly, but as it were in secret.

11 Then the Jews sought him at the feast, and said, Where is he?

12 And there was much murmuring among the people concerning him: for some said, He is a good man: others said, Nay; but he deceiveth the people.

13 Howbeit no man spake openly of him for fear of the Jews.

14 ¶ Now about the midst of the feast Jesus went up into the temple, and taught.

15 And the Jews marvelled, saying, How knoweth this man letters, having never learned?

16 Jesus answered them, and said, My doctrine is not mine, but his that sent me.

17 If any man will do his will, he shall know of the doctrine, whether it be of God, or whether I speak of myself.

18 He that speaketh of himself seeketh his own glory: but he that seeketh his glory that sent him, the same is true, and no unrighteousness is in him.

19 Did not Moses give you the law, and yet none of you keepeth the law? Why go ye about to kill me?

20 The people answered and said, Thou hast a devil: who goeth about to kill thee?

23 If a man on the sabbath day receive circumcision, that the law of Moses should not be broken; are ye angry at me, because I have made a man every whit whole on the sabbath day?

24 Judge not according to the appearance, but judge righteous judgment.

25 Then said some of them of Jerusalem, Is not this he, whom they seek to kill?

26 But, lo, he speaketh boldly, and they say nothing unto him. Do the rulers know indeed that this is the very Christ?

27 Howbeit we know this man whence he is: but when Christ cometh, no man knoweth whence he is.

28 Then cried Jesus in the temple as he taught, saying, Ye both know me, and ye know whence I am: and I am not come of myself, but he that sent me is true, whom ye know not.

29 But I know him: for I am from him, and he hath sent me.

30 Then they sought to take him: but no man laid hands on him, because his hour was not yet come.

31 And many of the people believed on him, and said, When Christ cometh, will he do more miracles than these which this man hath done?

32 ¶ The Pharisees heard that the people murmured such things concerning him; and the Pharisees and the chief priests sent officers to take him.

41 Others said, ^w This is the Christ. But some said, Shall Christ come ^x out of Galilee?

42 Hath not the scripture said, That Christ cometh ^y of the seed of David, and out of the town of ^z Bethlehem, ^{aa} where David was?

43 So there was ^{ab} a division among the people because of him.

44 And ^{ac} some of them would have taken him; but no man laid hands on him.

45 ¶ Then came ^{ad} the officers to the chief priests and Pharisees; and they said unto them, Why have ye not brought him?

JESUS went unto the mount of Olives.

2 And ^a early in the morning he came again into the temple, and all the people came unto him; and ^b he sat down, and taught them.

3 And the scribes and Pharisees brought unto him a woman taken in adultery; and when they had set her in the midst,

4 They say unto him, Master, this woman was taken in adultery, in the very act.

5 Now ^a Moses in the law commanded us, that such should be stoned: but what sayest thou?

10 When Jesus had lifted up himself, and saw none but the woman, he said unto her, Woman, where are those thine accusers? hath no man condemned thee?

11 She said, No man, Lord. And Jesus said unto her, Neither do I condemn thee: go, and sin no more.

12 ¶ Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

13 The Pharisees therefore said unto him, Thou bearest record of thyself; thy record is not true.

14 Jesus answered and said unto them, Though I bear record of myself, yet my record is true: for I know whence I came, and whither I go.

15 Ye judge after the flesh; I judge no man.

16 And yet if I judge, my judgment is true: for I am not alone, but I and the Father that sent me.

17 It is also written in your law, that the testimony of two men is true.

18 I am one that bear witness of myself, and the Father that sent me beareth witness of me.

19 Then said they unto him, Where is thy Father? Jesus answered, Ye neither know me, nor my Father: if ye had known me, ye should have known my Father also.

20 These words spake Jesus

in the treasury, as he taught in the temple: and no man laid hands on him; for his hour was not yet come.

21 Then said Jesus again unto them, I go my way, and ye shall seek me, and shall die in your sins: whither I go, ye cannot come.

22 Then said the Jews, Will he kill himself? because he saith, Whither I go, ye cannot come.

23 And he said unto them, Ye are from beneath; I am from above: ye are of this world; I am not of this world.

24 I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I am he, ye shall die in your sins.

25 Then said they unto him, Who art thou? And Jesus saith unto them, Even the same that I said unto you from the beginning.

26 I have many things to say and to judge of you: but he that sent me is true; and I speak to the world those things which I have heard of him.

27 They understood not that he spake to them of the Father.

28 Then said Jesus unto them, When ye have lifted up the Son of man, then shall ye know that I am he, and that I do nothing of myself; but as my Father hath taught me, I speak these things.

29 And he that sent me is with me; the Father hath not left me alone; for I do always those things that please him.

30 As he spake these words, many believed on him.

31 Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him,

If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed;

32 And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

34 Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, ^cWhosoever committeth sin is the servant of sin.

35 And ^dthe servant abideth not in the house for ever: but ^ethe Son abideth ever.

36 If ^fthe Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.

37 I know that ye are Abraham's ^gseed; but ^hye seek to kill me, because my word hath no place in you.

38 I speak that which I have ⁱseen with my Father: and ye do that which ye have seen with ^jyour father.

39 They answered and said unto him, Abraham is our father. Jesus saith unto them, ^kIf ye were Abraham's children, ye would do the works of Abraham.

40 But now ^lye seek to kill me, a man that hath told you the truth, which I have ^mheard of God: this did not Abraham.

41 Ye do the deeds of your father. Then said they to him, ⁿWe be not born of fornication; we have ^oone Father, *even* God.

42 Jesus said unto them, If God were your Father, ^pye would love me: for ^qI proceeded forth and came from God; ^rneither came I of myself, but ^she sent me.

43 Why do ye not understand my speech? ^teven because ye cannot hear my word.

44 Ye are of your father the devil, and the lusts of your father ye will do. He was ^ua murderer from the beginning, and abode not in the truth, because there is no truth in him.

When ^vhe speaketh a lie, he speaketh of his own: for he is a liar, and the father of it.

45 And because I tell you the truth, ye believe me not.

46 Which of you ^cconvinceth me of sin? And ^d(if I say the truth, why do ye not believe me?

47 He that is of God heareth God's words: ye therefore hear them not, because ^eye are not of God.

48 Then answered ^fthe Jews, and said unto him, Say we not well that thou art a ^gSamaritan, and ^hhast a devil?

49 Jesus answered, I have not a devil; but I honour my Father, and ye do dishonour me.

50 And I seek not ⁱmine own glory: there is one that seeketh and judgeth.

51 Verily, verily, I say unto you, ^jIf a man keep my saying, he shall never see death.

52 Then said the Jews unto him, Now we know that thou hast a devil. Abraham is dead, and the prophets; and thou sayest, If a man keep my saying, he shall never taste of death.

53 Art thou greater than our father Abraham, which is dead? and the prophets are dead: whom makest thou thyself?

54 Jesus answered, If I honour myself, my honour is nothing: ^kit is my Father that honoureth me; of whom ye say, that he is your God:

55 Yet ^lye have not known him; but I know him; and ^m(if I should say, I know him not, I shall be ⁿa liar like unto you: but I know him, and keep his saying.

56 Your father Abraham ^orejoiced to see my day: and he saw it, and was glad.

57 Then said the Jews unto him, Thou art not yet fifty years old, and hast thou seen Abraham?

58 Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was, ^pI am.

59 Then ^atook they up stones to cast at him: but Jesus ^bhid himself, and ^cwent out of the temple, ^dgoing through the midst of them, and so passed by.

CHAPTER 9.

¹ The man that was born blind restored to sight. ¹³ He is brought to the Pharisees, who are offended at it, and cast him out. ³⁸ He confesseth Christ.

AND as Jesus passed by, he saw a man which was blind from his birth.

2 And his disciples asked him, saying, ^o Master, ^h who did sin, this man, or ⁱ his parents, that he was born blind?

3 Jesus answered, Neither hath this man sinned, nor his parents: but ^m that the works of God should be made manifest in him. *Reason for Suffering*

4 I must work ⁿ the works of him that sent me, ^r while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work.

5 As long as I am in the world, ^s I am the light of the world.

6 When he had thus spoken, ^t he spat on the ground, and made clay of the spittle, and he ^u anointed the eyes of the blind man with the clay.

7 And said unto him, Go, wash in ^v the pool of Siloam, (which is by interpretation, Sent.) ^w He went his way therefore, and washed, and came seeing.

8 ¶ The neighbours therefore, and they which before had ^x seen him that he was blind, said, Is not this he ^y that sat and begged?

9 Some said, This is he: others said, He is like him: but he said, I am he.

10 Therefore said they unto him, How were thine eyes opened?

11 He answered and said, ^d A man that is called Jesus made clay, and anointed mine eyes, and said unto me, Go to the pool of Siloam, and wash: and I

went and washed, and I received sight.

12 Then said they unto him, Where is he? He said, I know not.

13 ¶ They brought to the Pharisees him that aforetime was blind.

14 And ^e it was the sabbath day when Jesus made the clay, and opened his eyes.

15 Then ^f again the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. He said unto them, He put clay upon mine eyes, and I washed, and do see.

16 Therefore said some of the Pharisees, This man is not ^g of God, ^h because he keepeth not the sabbath day. ⁱ Others said, ^j How can a man that is a sinner do such miracles? And ^k there was a division among them.

17 They say unto the blind man again, What sayest thou of him, that he hath opened thine eyes? He said, He is ^l a prophet.

18 But ^m the Jews did not believe concerning him, that he had been blind, and received his sight, until they called the parents of him that had received his sight.

19 And they asked them, saying, Is this your son, who ye say was born blind? how then doth he now see?

20 His parents answered them and said, We know that this is our son, and that he was born blind:

21 But by what means he now seeth, we know not; or who hath opened his eyes, we know not: he is of age; ask him: he shall speak for himself.

22 These words spake his parents, because ⁿ they feared the Jews: for ^o the Jews had agreed already, that if any man did confess that he was Christ, ^p he should be put out of the synagogue.

23 Therefore said his parents, He is of age; ask him.

24 Then again called they the man that was blind, and said unto him, Give God the praise: we know that this man is a sinner.

25 He answered and said, Whether he be a sinner or no, I know not: one thing I know, that, whereas I was blind, now I see.

26 Then said they to him again, What did he to thee? how opened he thine eyes?

27 He answered them, I have told you already, and ye did not hear: wherefore would ye hear it again? will ye also be his disciples?

28 Then they reviled him, and said, Thou art his disciple; but we are Moses' disciples.

29 We know that God spake unto Moses: as for this fellow, we know not from whence he is.

30 The man answered and said unto them, Why herein is a marvellous thing, that ye know not from whence he is, and yet he hath opened mine eyes.

31 Now we know that God heareth not sinners: but if any man be a worshipper of God, and doeth his will, him he heareth.

32 Since the world began was it not heard that any man opened the eyes of one that was born blind.

33 If this man were not of God, he could do nothing.

34 They answered and said unto him, Thou wast altogether born in sins, and dost thou teach us? And they cast him out.

35 Jesus heard that they had cast him out; and when he had found him, he said unto him, Dost thou believe on the Son of God?

CHAPTER 10.

1 Christ is the door, and the good shepherd. 24 He proveth by his works that he is Christ the Son of God.

VERILY, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber.

2 But he that entereth in by the door is the shepherd of the sheep.

3 To him the porter openeth; and the sheep hear his voice: and he calleth his own sheep by name, and leadeth them out.

4 And when he putteth forth his own sheep, he goeth before them, and the sheep follow him: for they know his voice.

5 And a stranger will they not follow, but will flee from him: for they know not the voice of strangers.

6 This parable spake Jesus unto them: but they understood not what things they were which he spake unto them.

7 Then said Jesus unto them again, Verily, verily, I say unto you, I am the door of the sheep.

9 I am the door: by me if any man enter in, he shall be saved, and shall go in and out, and find pasture.

10 The thief cometh not, but for to steal, and to kill, and to destroy: I am come that they might have life, and that they might have it more abundantly.

11 I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.

12 But he that is an hireling, and not the shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, seeth the wolf coming, and leaveth the sheep, and fleeth: and the wolf catcheth them, and scattereth the sheep.

13 The hireling fleeth, because he is an hireling, and careth not for the sheep.

14 I am the good shepherd, and know my sheep, and am known of mine.

15 As the Father knoweth me, even so know I the Father: and I lay down my life for the sheep.

16 And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: I them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd.

17 Therefore doth my Father love me, because I lay down my life, that I might take it again.

18 No man taketh it from me, but I lay it down of myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again. This commandment have I received of my Father.

19 ¶ There was a division therefore again among the Jews for these sayings.

20 And many of them said, He hath a devil, and is mad; why hear ye him?

22 ¶ And it was at Jerusalem the feast of the dedication, and it was winter.

23 And Jesus walked in the temple in Solomon's porch.

24 Then came the Jews round about him, and said unto him, How long dost thou make us to doubt? If thou be the Christ, tell us plainly.

25 Jesus answered them, I told you, and ye believed not: the works that I do in my Father's name, they bear witness of me.

26 But ye believe not, because ye are not of my sheep, as I said unto you.

27 My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:

28 And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand.

29 My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand.

30 I and my Father are one.

31 Then the Jews took up stones again to stone him.

32 Jesus answered them, Many good works have I shewed you from my Father; for which of those works do ye stone me?

33 The Jews answered him, saying, For a good work we stone thee not; but for blasphemy; and because that thou, being a man, makest thyself God.

34 Jesus answered them, Is it not written in your law, I said, Ye are gods?

35 If he called them gods, unto whom the word of God came, and the scripture cannot be broken;

36 Say ye of him, whom the Father hath sanctified, and sent into the world, Thou blasphemest; because I said, I am the Son of God?

4 When Jesus heard *that*, he said, This sickness is not unto death, ^v but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby.

5 Now Jesus ^w loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus.

6 When he had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode two days still ^d in the same place where he was.

7 Then after that saith he to his disciples, Let us go into Judæa again.

8 His disciples say unto him, ^y Master, ^z the Jews of late sought to stone thee; and goest thou thither again?

9 Jesus answered, ^b Are there not twelve hours in the day? ^d If any man walk in the day, he stumbleth not, because he seeth the light of this world.

10 But ^f if a man walk in the night, he stumbleth, because there is no light in him.

11 These things said he: and after that he saith unto them, Our ⁱ friend Lazarus ^k sleepeth; but I go, that I may awake him out of sleep.

12 Then said his disciples, Lord, if he sleep, he shall ^m do well.

13 Howbeit Jesus spake of his death: but they thought that he had spoken of taking of rest in sleep.

14 Then said Jesus unto them plainly, Lazarus is dead.

15 And I am glad for your sakes that I was not there, to the intent ye may believe; nevertheless let us go unto him.

16 Then said ^o Thomas, ^t which is called Didymus, unto his fellowdisciples, Let us also go, that we may die with him.

17 Then when Jesus came, he found that he had *lain* in the grave ^u four days already.

18 Now Bethany was nigh unto Jerusalem, ^v about fifteen furlongs off:

19 And many of the Jews came ^w to Martha and Mary, to comfort them concerning their brother.

20 Then Martha, ^b as soon as she heard that Jesus was coming, went and met him: but Mary ^e sat *still* in the house.

21 Then said Martha unto Jesus, ^e Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died.

22 But I know, that even now, ^f whatsoever thou wilt ask of God, God will give *it* thee.

23 Jesus saith unto her, Thy brother shall rise again.

seeing Jesus raise Lazarus
from the grave"*

24 Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again ^a in the resurrection at the last day.

25 Jesus said unto her, I am ^c the resurrection, and the ^d life: ^f he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:

26 And whosoever liveth and believeth in me ^g shall never die. Believest thou this?

27 She saith unto him, Yea, Lord: I believe that ^h thou art the Christ, ⁱ the Son of God, ^j which should come into the world.

28 And when she had so said, she went her way, and called Mary her sister secretly, saying, ^k The Master is come, and calleth for thee.

29 As soon as she heard ^l that, she arose quickly, and came unto him.

30 Now Jesus was not yet come into the town, but was in that place ^m where Martha met him.

31 ⁿ The Jews then which were with her in the house, and comforted her, when they saw Mary, ^o that she rose up hastily and went out, followed her, saying, She goeth unto the grave to weep there.

32 Then when Mary was come where Jesus was, and saw him, she ^p fell down at his feet, saying unto him, ^q Lord, if thou hadst been here, my brother had not died.

33 When Jesus therefore saw her weeping, and the Jews also weeping which came with her, he groaned in the spirit, and ^r was troubled,

34 And said, Where have ye laid him? They said unto him, Lord, come and see.

35 ^s Jesus wept.

36 Then said the Jews, Behold ^t how he loved him!

37 And some of them said, Could not this man, ^u which

opened the eyes of the blind, have caused that even this man should not have died?

38 Jesus therefore again ^v groaning in himself cometh to the grave. It was ^w a cave, and ^x a stone lay upon it.

39 Jesus said, ^y Take ye away the stone. Martha, the sister of him that was dead, saith unto him, Lord, by this time he stinketh: for he ^z hath been dead four days.

40 Jesus saith unto her, ^{aa} Said I not unto thee, that, ^{ab} if thou wouldest believe, thou shouldst see ^{ac} the glory of God?

41 Then they took away ^{ad} the stone from the place where the dead was laid. And Jesus ^{ae} lifted up his eyes, and said, ^{af} Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me.

42 And I knew that thou hearest me always: but ^{ag} because of the people which stand by I said ^{ah} it, that they may ^{ai} believe that thou hast sent me.

43 And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, ^{aj} Lazarus, come forth.

44 And he that was dead came forth, ^{ak} bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go.

45 Then ^{al} many of the Jews which came to Mary, and ^{am} had seen the things which Jesus did, believed on him.

46 But some of them went their ways to ^{an} the Pharisees, and told them what things Jesus had done.

47 ¶ Then ^{ao} gathered the chief priests and the Pharisees a council, and said, What do we? for this man doeth many miracles.

48 If we let him thus alone, all ^{ap} men will believe on him: and ^{aq} the Romans shall come and take away both our ^{ar} place and ^{as} nation.

^p they took counsel together for

55 ¶ And ^v the Jews' passover
 was nigh at hand: and many

 Jerusalem before the passover,

which ^h had been dead, whom
 he raised from the dead.

2 There ^o they made him a
 supper; and Martha served:
 but Lazarus was one of them
 that sat at the table with him.

3 Then took ^e Mary ^f a pound
 of ointment of spikenard, very
 costly, and ^g anointed the feet
 of Jesus, and ^h wiped his feet
 with her hair: and the house
 was filled with the odour of the
 ointment.

4 Then saith one of his dis-
 ciples, Judas Iscariot, ⁱ Simon's
 son, which should betray him,

5 Why was not this ointment
 sold for three hundred pence,
 and given to the poor?

6 This he said, not that he
 cared for the poor; but because
 he was a thief, and ^q had the
 bag, and ^r bare what was put
 therein.

7 Then said Jesus, Let her
 alone: against the day of my
^u burying hath she kept this.

8 For the poor always ye have
 with you; but me ye have not
 always. *Jo. Deut. 15: 11*

9 Much people of ^s the Jews
 therefore knew that he was
 there: and they came not for
 Jesus' sake only, but that they
 might see Lazarus also, ^e whom
 he had raised from the dead.

10 ¶ But ^e the chief priests
^f consulted that they might put
 Lazarus also to death;

11 Because ^v that by reason of
 him ^h many of ^s the Jews went
 away, and believed on Jesus.

12 ¶ On the next day ⁱ much
 people that were come to ^k the
 feast, when they heard that Je-
 sus was coming to Jerusalem,

13 Took branches of palm
 trees, and went forth to meet
 him, and cried, Hosanna:
ⁱ Blessed is the King of Israel
 that cometh in the name of the
 Lord.

14 And Jesus, when he had
 found a young ass, sat thereon;
 as it is written,

*This says when the
 came - not when the
 feast was.*

15 Fear not, daughter of Sion: behold, thy King cometh, sitting on an ass's colt.

16 These things understood not his disciples at the first: but when Jesus was glorified, then remembered they that these things were written of him, and that they had done these things unto him.

17 The people therefore that was with him when he called Lazarus out of his grave, and raised him from the dead, bare record.

18 For this cause the people also met him, for that they heard that he had done this miracle.

19 The Pharisees therefore said among themselves, Perceive ye how ye prevail nothing? behold, the world is gone after him.

20 And there were certain Greeks among them that came up to worship at the feast:

21 The same came therefore to Philip, which was of Bethsaida of Galilee, and desired him, saying, Sir, we would see Jesus.

22 Philip cometh and telleth Andrew: and again Andrew and Philip tell Jesus.

23 And Jesus answered them, saying, The hour is come, that the Son of man should be glorified.

24 Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abideth alone: but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit.

25 He that loveth his life shall lose it; and he that hateth his life in this world shall keep it unto life eternal.

26 If any man serve me, let him follow me; and where I am, there shall also my servant be: if any man serve me, him will my Father honour.

27 Now is my soul troubled; and what shall I say? Father,

29 The people therefore, that stood by, and heard it, said that it thundered: others said, An angel spake to him.

30 Jesus answered and said, This voice came not because of me, but for your sakes.

31 Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out.

32 And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.

33 This he said, signifying what death he should die.

34 The people answered him, We have heard out of the law that Christ abideth for ever: and how sayest thou, The Son of man must be lifted up? who is this Son of man?

35 Then Jesus said unto them, Yet a little while is the light with you. Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you: for he that walketh in darkness knoweth not whither he goeth.

36 While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light. These things spake Jesus, and departed, and did hide himself from them.

37 But though he had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him:

41 These things said Esaias, ^awhen he saw his glory, and spake of him.

42 ¶ Nevertheless among ^bthe chief rulers also many believed on him; but ^c'because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest ^d'they should be put out of the synagogue:

43 For they loved ^ethe praise of men more than the praise of God.

44 ¶ Jesus cried and said, ^f'He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, ^g'but on him that sent me.

45 And ^h'he that seeth me seeth him that sent me.

46 ⁱ'I am come a light into the world, that whosoever believeth on me should not abide in darkness.

12 So after he had washed their feet, and ^t'had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, Know ye what I have done to you?

LET not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.

2 In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you.

3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. *go no more out*

4 And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know.

5 Thomas saith unto him, Lord, we know not whither thou goest; and how can we know the way?

⁵ They answered him, Jesus of Nazareth. Jesus saith unto them, I am *he*. And Judas also, which betrayed him, stood with them.

⁶ As soon then as he had said unto them, I am *he*, they went backward, and fell to the ground.

⁷ Then asked he them again, Whom seek ye? And they said, Jesus of Nazareth.

⁸ Jesus answered, I have told you that I am *he*: if therefore ye seek me, let these go their way:

⁹ That the saying might be fulfilled, which he spake, ^o Of them which thou gavest me have I lost none.

¹⁰ Then Simon Peter having a sword drew it, and smote the high priest's servant, and cut off his right ear. The servant's name was Malchus.

¹¹ Then said Jesus unto Peter, Put up thy sword into the sheath: ^u the cup which my Father hath given me, shall I not drink it?

¹² Then ^v the band and the captain and officers of the Jews took Jesus, and bound him,

¹³ And ^w led him away to ^a Annas first; for he was father in law to ^b Caiaphas, which was the high priest ^c that same year.

¹⁴ Now Caiaphas was he, which gave counsel to the Jews, ^e that it was expedient that one man should die for the people.

¹⁷ Then saith ^k the damsel that kept the door unto Peter, Art not thou also *one* of this man's disciples? He saith, I am not.

¹⁸ And the servants and officers stood there, who had made a fire of coals; for ~~it was cold~~; and they warmed themselves: and Peter stood with them, and warmed himself.

¹⁹ ¶ The high priest then asked Jesus of his disciples, and of his doctrine.

²⁰ Jesus answered him, I spake ^m openly to the world; I ever taught ⁿ in the synagogue, and ^o in the temple, whither the Jews always resort; and ^p in secret have I said nothing.

²¹ Why askest thou me? ask them which heard me, what I have said unto them: behold, ^r they know what I said.

²² And when he had thus spoken, one of the ^s officers which stood by ^t struck Jesus ^v with the palm of his hand, saying, Answerest thou the high priest so?

²³ Jesus answered him, If I have spoken evil, bear witness of the evil: but if well, why smitest thou me?

²⁴ Now Annas ^w had sent him bound unto Caiaphas the high priest.

²⁵ And Simon Peter stood and warmed himself. ^d They said therefore unto him, Art not thou also *one* of his disciples? He denied *it*, and said, I am not.

²⁶ One of the servants of the high priest, being *his* kinsman

^a whose ear Peter cut off, saith, Did not I see thee in the garden with him?

²⁷ Peter then denied again: and immediately ^e the cock crew.

²⁸ ¶ Then led they Jesus from ¹ Caiaphas unto ² the hall of judgment: and it was early; ³ and they themselves went not into the judgment hall, ⁴ lest they should be defiled; but ^m that they might eat the pass-over.

²⁹ ¶ Pilate then went out unto them, and said, What accusation bring ye against this man?

³⁰ They answered and said unto him, If he were not a malefactor, we would not have delivered him up unto thee.

³¹ Then said Pilate unto them, Take ye him, and ^r judge him according to your law. The Jews therefore said unto him, It is not lawful for us to put any man to death:

³² That the saying of Jesus might be fulfilled, which he spake, "signifying what death he should die.

³³ Then Pilate entered into the judgment hall again, and called Jesus, and said unto him, ² Art thou the King of the Jews?

³⁴ Jesus answered him, Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or did others tell it thee of me?

³⁵ Pilate answered, Am I a Jew? Thine own nation and the chief priests have delivered thee unto me: what hast thou done?

³⁶ Jesus answered, ^c My kingdom is not ^d of this world: if my kingdom were of this world, then would ⁷ my servants ⁸ fight, that I should not ^h be delivered to the Jews: but now is my kingdom not from hence.

³⁷ Pilate therefore said unto him, Art thou a king then? Jesus answered, ⁱ Thou sayest that I am a king. ^m To this end

CHAPTER 19.

¹ Christ is scourged, crowned with thorns, and beaten. ⁴ Pilate delivereth him to be crucified. ²⁶ He commendeth his mother to John. ²⁸ He dieth. ³¹ His side is pierced. ³⁸ His burial.

THEN Pilate therefore took Jesus, and ^s scourged him.

² And ^t the soldiers platted a crown of thorns, and put it on his head, and they put on him ^u a purple robe, *Curse of earth*

³ And said, Hail, King of the Jews! and they ^v smote him with their hands.

⁴ Pilate therefore ^w went forth again, and saith unto them, Behold, I bring him forth to you, that ye may know that ^b I find no fault in him.

⁵ Then came Jesus forth, wearing the crown of thorns, and the purple robe. And ^x Pilate saith unto them, Behold the man!

⁶ When the chief priests therefore and ^y officers saw him, they cried out, saying, Crucify him, crucify him. Pilate saith unto them, Take ye him, and crucify him: for I find no fault in him.

⁷ The Jews answered him, ^z We have a law, and by our law he ought to die, because ^h he made himself the Son of God.

⁸ ¶ When Pilate therefore

heard that saying, ^a he was the more afraid;

⁹ And went ^c again into the judgment hall, and saith unto Jesus, ^d Whence art thou? But ^e Jesus gave him no answer.

¹⁰ Then saith Pilate unto him, Speakest thou not unto me? knowest thou not that I have power to crucify thee, and have power to release thee?

¹¹ Jesus answered, Thou couldst have no ^o power at all against me, except it were ⁱ given thee ^h from above: therefore ^g he that delivered me unto thee hath the greater sin.

¹² And from thenceforth Pilate sought to release him: but the Jews cried out, saying, If thou let this man go, thou art not Cæsar's friend: ^p whosoever maketh himself a king speaketh against Cæsar.

¹³ ¶ When Pilate therefore heard that saying, ^q he brought Jesus forth, and sat down in ^r the judgment seat in a place that is called the Pavement, but ^s in the Hebrew, Gabbatha.

¹⁴ And it was ^t the preparation of the passover, and about ^v the sixth hour: and he saith unto the Jews, ^u Behold your King!

¹⁵ But they cried out, ^w Away with him, away with him, crucify him. Pilate saith unto them, Shall I crucify your King? The chief priests answered, ^x We have no king but Cæsar.

¹⁶ Then ^y delivered he him therefore unto them to be crucified. And ^z they took Jesus, and led him away.

¹⁷ And he ^{aa} bearing his cross ^{ab} went forth into a place called the place of a skull, which is called in the Hebrew Golgotha:

¹⁸ Where they crucified him, and ^{ac} two other with him, on either side one, and Jesus in the midst.

¹⁹ ¶ And Pilate wrote a title, and put it on the cross. And

²⁰ This title then read many of the Jews: for the place where Jesus was crucified was nigh to the city: and it was written ⁱ in Hebrew, and Greek, and Latin.

²¹ Then said the chief priests of the Jews to Pilate, Write not, The King of the Jews; but that he said, I am King of the Jews.

²² Pilate answered, ^h What I have written I have written.

²³ ¶ Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took his garments, and made four parts, ⁿ to every soldier a part; and also his coat: now the coat was ^o without seam, ^q woven from the top throughout.

²⁴ They said therefore among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, ^r They parted my raiment among them, and for my vesture they did cast lots. These things therefore the soldiers did.

²⁵ ¶ Now there stood by the cross ^s of Jesus his mother, and his mother's sister, ^t Mary the wife of ^u Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene. *Ch. 20. 1, 11*

²⁶ When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, ^v whom he loved, he saith unto his mother, ^w Woman, behold thy son!

²⁷ Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto ^x his own home.

²⁸ ¶ After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that ^y the scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst.

²⁹ Now there was set ^z a vessel full of vinegar: and ^{aa} they filled a sponge with vinegar, and put it upon ^{ab} hyssop, and put it to his mouth.

³⁰ When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said,

³² Then came the soldiers, and brake the legs of the first, and of the other which was crucified with him.

³³ But when they came to Jesus, and saw that he was dead already, they brake not his legs:

³⁴ But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced his side, and forthwith came there out ^h blood and water.

³⁵ And he that saw *it* bare record, and his record is true: and ⁱ he knoweth that he saith true, that ye might believe.

³⁶ For these things were done, that the scripture should be fulfilled, ^h "A bone of him shall not be broken."

³⁷ And again another scripture saith, ^o They shall look on him whom they pierced.

³⁸ ¶ And after this Joseph of Arimathæa, being a disciple of Jesus, but secretly ^r for fear of the Jews, besought Pilate that he might take away the body of Jesus: and Pilate gave *him* leave. He came therefore, and took the body of Jesus.

³⁹ And there came also ^u Nicodemus, which at the first came to Jesus by night, and ^v brought a mixture of ^w myrrh and ^x aloes, about an hundred ^y pound weight.

⁴⁰ Then took they the body of Jesus, and ^z wound it in linen clothes with the spices, as the manner of the Jews is to ^z bury.

⁴¹ Now in the place where he was crucified there was a gar-

den; and in the garden a new sepulchre, wherein was never man yet laid.

⁴² There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' ^a preparation day; for the sepulchre was nigh at hand.

CHAPTER 20.

¹ Mary cometh to the sepulchre: ³ as also Peter and John. ¹¹ Jesus appeareth to Mary Magdalene, ¹⁹ and to his disciples. ²⁴ The incredulity, and confession of Thomas.

THE ^o first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth ^h the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

² Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, ⁱ whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him.

³ ^m Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre.

⁴ So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre.

⁵ And he ^p stooping down, and looking in, saw ^q the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in.

⁶ Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie,

⁷ And ^t the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place ^u by itself.

⁸ Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed.

⁹ For as yet they ^v knew not the ^w scripture, that he must rise again from the dead.

¹⁰ Then the disciples went away again ^x unto their own home.

20 And when he had so said, he shewed unto them his hands and his side. Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the Lord.

21 Then said Jesus to them again, Peace be unto you: as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you.

24 ¶ But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.

25 The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.

26 ¶ And after eight days again his disciples were within, and Thomas with them: then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace be unto you.

27 Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing.

28 And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God.

29 Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

30 ¶ And many other signs truly did Jesus in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book:

31 But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name.

CHAPTER 21.

¹ Christ appeareth again to his disciples. ⁶ The great draught of fishes. ¹⁵ Christ's charge to Peter. ¹⁸ He foretelleth him of his death. ²⁵ The conclusion.

AFTER these things Jesus ^a shewed himself again to the disciples ^b at the sea of Tiberias; and on this wise shewed he *himself*.

² There were together Simon Peter, and Thomas ^c called Didymus, and ^d Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, and ^e the sons of Zebedee, and two other of his disciples.

³ Simon Peter saith unto them, I go a fishing. They say unto him, We also go with thee. They went forth, and entered into a ship immediately; and ^f that night they caught nothing.

⁴ But when the morning was now come, ^g Jesus stood on the shore: but the disciples ^h knew not that it was Jesus.

⁵ Then Jesus saith unto them, ⁱ Children, have ye any meat? ^j They answered him, No.

⁶ And ^k he said unto them, Cast the net on the right side of the ship, and ye shall find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes.

⁷ Therefore that disciple ^l whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he ^m girt his fisher's coat *unto him*, (for he was ⁿ naked,) and did cast himself into the sea.

⁸ And the other disciples came in ^o a little ship; (for they were not far from land, but as it were two hundred cubits,) dragging the net with fishes.

⁹ As soon then as they were come to land, they saw ^p a fire of coals there, and ^q fish laid thereon, and bread.

¹⁰ Jesus saith unto them,

Bring of the fish which ye have now caught.

¹¹ Simon Peter went up, and drew the net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken.

¹² Jesus saith unto them, ^r Come and ^s dine. And none of the disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord.

¹³ Jesus then cometh, and ^t taketh bread, and giveth them, and fish likewise.

¹⁴ This is now ^u the third time that Jesus shewed himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.

¹⁵ ¶ So when they had dined, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, ^v Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me ^w more than these? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my lambs.

¹⁶ He saith to him again the second time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my sheep.

¹⁷ He saith unto him the third time, Simon, son of Jonas, lovest thou me? Peter was grieved because he said unto him ^x the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, ^y thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, Feed my sheep.
